Public policy advocacy is the process of influencing policy decision-makers (politicians, their staff and civil servants) with the goal of changing government laws and policies.

In this course students will learn about the strategies and context for public policy advocacy through seminars, expert guest speakers and an intensive internship with an advocacy organization.
